

Prof. Jerzy Gilarowski

Prof. Jerzy Gilarowski is a Senior Lecturer at the Mkwawa University College of Education in Iringa/Tanzania. He is a geographer specializing in in Sub-Saharan issues (MAN and ENVIRONMENT RELATIONSHIP). He spent 20 years at the University of Warsaw/Poland, where he did his Master and PhD dissertations. Apart from teaching, from 1993 until present, he have carried out many research projects in several Sub-Saharan Africa countries. For example in 1993, he did a research about deforestation in Sud-Kivu Province (Zaire); in 1995, a research about environmental changes caused by refugees from Liberia in Taï National Park (Côte d'Ivoire); in 1999, about degradation of the environment around refugees camps in DRC; in 2000, in Sudan, about economic and social changes due to the construction of a Nile dam at the IVth cataract; in 2003 around town of Goma in Congo about environmental and social consequences of Nyiragongo volcano eruption; in 2010 and 2015, in Tanzania, about climate change and the need of adjustments in Tanzanian agriculture. Since 2003 hewas working (with some breaks) on contract terms at different universities in Tanzania (University of Dar es Salaam, University of Dodoma, University of Iringa). Since 2016 he works at MKWAWA University College in Iringa. For 25 years of his teaching carrier he has been delivering lectures from almost all fields of geography.He is the author of 4 books (5th in preparation) and around 50 articles in scientific reviews.
